Saint-Romain

AOP Saint-Romain, Bourgogne, France

PRESENTATION

Saint-Romain is located on the Côte de Beaune. It is one of the first sanctuaries of Celtic and Gallo-Roman vineyards in Burgundy.

LOCATION

Saint Romain is a small village located in the southwest of Beaune at the bottom of a valley ending in cliffs in Côte-d'Or.

TERROIR

The vineyards are facing south/southeast and north/northeast on steep slopes and on excellent soils with a variable composition: marly, limestone, with some clayey layers in places.

WINEMAKING

Vinification in open thermoregulated vats at 28/30 °C with punching down. Aging in oak barrels for 14 months.

VARIETAL

Pinot Noir

SERVING

Service temperature: 14°C.
Enjoy now or keep for up to 5 years.

TASTING

Beautiful deep ruby color.
The wine expresses aromas of blackcurrant and fresh raspberries but also some toasted notes and a hint of more animal notes like leather.
With a beautiful texture in the mouth, this smooth wine with melted tannins presents a nice overall balance with a intensely fruity aromatic persistence.

FOOD PAIRINGS

Classic pairing: Spinach and goat cheese quiche.
Unusual pairing: Leg of lamb with Provence herbs.
