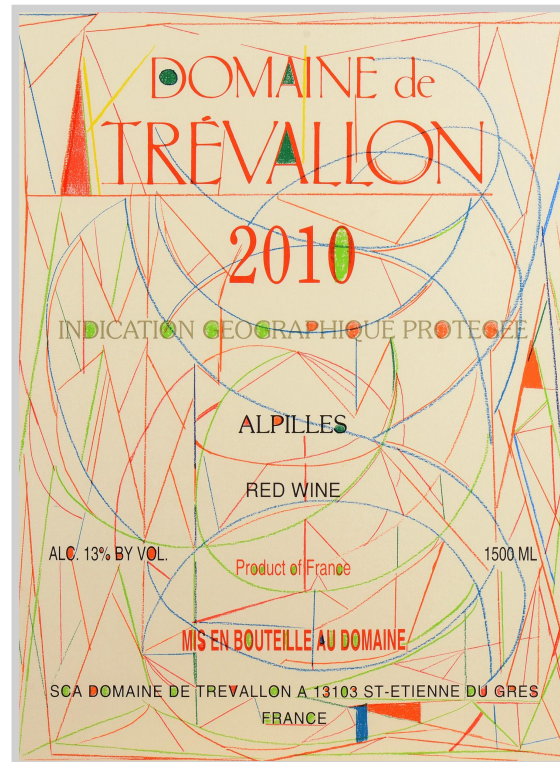


Domaine de Trévallon rouge 2010
