



Her son Jean married the descendant of an old winemaking family who owned the land around Vieux Lazaret # where he was mayor from 1852 to 1860.

He moved the estate's headquarters to Vieux Lazaret and slowly enlarged it through marriage or purchase. In 1873, woodland was bought to satisfy the family's passion for hunting (The Combes d'Arnevels).

In 1875 the entire vineyard was destroyed by phylloxera, a small insect that eats the roots of vines, eventually killing them. Our family was ruined and took up quarrying, the silk trade and farming #. The vineyard was replanted Grenache grapes. Neither the 1914-1918 war, the economic crisis of 1929 nor the Second World War were helpful to the expansion or development of the estate.

In 1980 Geneviève and Jérôme Quiot decided to relaunch bottle sales.
