## Northern Rhône, Domaine Barou, Petit Colorado, IGP Collines Rhodaniennes, Rouge IGP Collines Rhodaniennes, France

Domaine BAROU is a family farm located in the northern part of the Côtes du Rhône. As early as 1971, Alexis BAROU, then at the head of this small mixed-farming-breeding farm, took the risk of opting for a total conversion to organic farming. In 1997, Emmanuel, his son, took over the family torch and oriented the operation more towards arboriculture and especially viticulture. This specialization is reflected in the planting of new plots in AOC Saint-Joseph and Condrieu.

### PRESENTATION

Vin de Pays from the Rhone hills, 100% Syrah.

### TERROIR

2 ha in the town of Charnas, on the plateau overlooking the Rhône Valley.

### IN THE VINEYARD

The vines are all less than 20 years old.

### WINEMAKING

Harvest 80% destemmed harvest. Alcoholic fermentation and maceration for 12 days at a temperature of 28 ° C. Pumping over once a day.

### AGEING

Aging in stainless steel vats for 6 months.

### VARIETAL

Syrah 100%

### SERVING

61F

### AGEING POTENTIAL

2 to 3 years

### TASTING

Purple dress. Nose on fresh, vegetal, minty notes. The freshness is also on the palate with crunchy red fruits and discreet tannins. The wine is airy. Wine to drink within 2 to 3 years.

### FOOD PAIRINGS

To be consumed with a cold meats board or in summer, slightly chilled, as an accompaniment to grilled meats
